


The fourth annual Jail Cost Report (FY01) prepared by the Compensation Board as required by the provisions of Item 63.L.1 - 63.L.3. of Chapter 899, 2002 Acts of Assembly is now available on the Compensation Board's website, <http://www.scb.state.va.us> under Publications and Forms. The Compensation Board is required to annually prepare a report detailing all expenditures and revenues of Virginia's local and regional jails and jail farms. This report contains those items for FY2001 along with a brief profile of each facility and its operating environment. The report also displays the flow of federal revenue in funding Virginia's jails. We have included comparative data for fiscal years 1999, 2000 and 2001.



DNA Procedure Questions



Prince William/Manassas Regional Jail's Carol Moyer asked Division of Forensic Science's Linda Johnston several very good questions about the new DNA procedures. The following are the questions and answers:

- Q:** Are there any storage requirements for the buccal swabs?
- A:** No, they can be stored at room temperature. Just return to us within 15 days of obtaining the sample. Until they are mailed, they need to be kept in a secure place.
- Q:** Will they be mailed?
- A:** You can return them to us by mailing or delivering the samples to our lab. We will provide a mailing sticker that you can put on a larger envelope, not the buccal swab kit, and send to us through the mail. We ask that you come to the lab to pick up more kits as needed.
- Q:** Is all corresponding paper work included in the kit?
- A:** Yes, the submission form will be attached to each kit. Now you can submit 11 samples on one of our submission forms, but with the new kits the submission form will be attached. Instructions will be provided with each kit, too.
- Q:** Is it possible to receive a sample kit prior to December? We were also interested in the size of the kit for storage purposes.
- A:** The kits will come in a 9" x 12" envelope; the kits inside the envelope will be 6" X 9". I think that there will be 50 kits per box. We don't have the kits made yet, but the Division of Forensic Science hopes to have them out by the middle of December.

GOVERNOR WARNER SALUTES DIVISION OF FORENSIC SCIENCE ON 1000th "COLD HIT"

...WE SALUTE THE LIDS USERS FOR THEIR DNA SAMPLE RECORDING EFFORTS

Governor Warner announced the number of "cold hits" by investigators using Virginia's DNA Data Bank in the following November 15, 2002 Press Release.

GOVERNOR MARKS MILESTONE FOR DNA DATABASE

-- Gov. Warner salutes Division of Forensic Science on 1,000th "cold hit" --

RICHMOND - Governor Mark R. Warner today toured the Virginia Division of Forensic Science in Richmond to mark the 1,000th DNA Data Bank "cold hit," when DNA from a crime scene is matched to an offender or matched to DNA from another crime scene, linking the two crimes to a single perpetrator.

Governor Warner noted the achievement during graduation exercises for the 59th session of the Virginia Forensic Science Academy, which trains law enforcement personnel to properly recognize, collect, and preserve physical evidence found at crime scenes for laboratory examination.

"Criminals cannot run from the long arm of science," Governor Warner said. "The Commonwealth is a national leader in the use of DNA in criminal investigations. Our scientific edge has not only produced leads in cases that have confounded police for years, but actually taken lethal criminals off the street."

Virginia was the first state in the nation to start DNA testing in May 1989. The same year, Virginia created the first DNA databank for sex offenders in the United States. One year later, the DataBank was expanded to include all felons, and in 1996 the database was expanded to include juveniles 14 years or older convicted of a felony. Virginia's DNA Data Bank, the oldest and most comprehensive in the country, now contains the genetic profiles of more than 187,000 convicted felons.

According to Dr. Paul B. Ferrara, director of the Division of Forensic Science, the 1,000th "cold hit" on Wednesday, November 13, 2002 identified a potential suspect in a sexual assault that occurred in the city of Richmond in April 2001. Armed with this scientific information, police can now focus the investigation on the depositor of the genetic material left at the crime scene.

As of October 31, 2002, DNA database matches have helped solve 109 homicides, 241 rapes, 12 rape/homicides, nine malicious woundings, 14 carjackings, 57 robberies, 465 burglaries or larcenies, and 86 assorted other crimes. These "hits" also included 38 cases from other states in which a suspect was identified through genetic information on file in Virginia's DNA Data Bank.

"Virginia is safer today because the state moved aggressively to set up the DNA database 13 years ago, and the benefits are about to increase dramatically," Governor Warner said.

Beginning January 1, 2003, every person charged with a violent felony in Virginia will submit a DNA sample. Under provisions of the law signed by Governor Warner, those DNA records will be expunged if the suspect is acquitted or the case is dismissed.

EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2003 THE COMPENSATION BOARD WILL REQUEST LIDS USERS TO SUSPEND RECORDING DNA SAMPLES IN LIDS. INSTEAD, LIDS USERS WILL BE REQUIRED TO RECORD DNA INFORMATION IN THE COMPENSATION BOARD'S DNA WEB-BASED TRACKING SYSTEM.

The LIDS DNA Sample Tracking system was deployed in October, 2002 and is located on the Compensation Board's website (www.scb.state.va.us) under the Restricted Access button.

REMINDER
THIRD OFFENSE
PETTY LARCENY

Several LIDS users have attempted to use VCC Statute §18.2-96, entitled PETIT LARCENY—THIRD CONVICTION, VCC Code LAR-2369-F6. However, the **END DATE of this statute was 6/30/96.**

The Statute that applies **effective 7/1/96** is §18.2-104, entitled PETIT LARCENY—THIRD OR SUBSEQUENT CONVICTION, VCC Code LAR-2369-F6. The codes used on the warrant are for the crimes that he committed, but since this is the offender's third larceny offense, it is elevated to a felony. This VCC code is used for all felony and larceny misdemeanors that are elevated to a felony for a third offense.
