INMATES FOUND NOT GUILTY BY REASON OF INSANITY

Several LIDS users inquired as to how to record an inmate that goes to court and the court finds him/her not guilty by reason of insanity, with a court order to be held in jail until transfer to a mental health facility. The Compensation Board recommends the procedure be followed as of the disposition date:

1. Change Reason Confined Code to 10 - Not serving time on other charges/Pre-trial
2. Use VCC Offense Code PRI9917S9, Temporary Hold
3. Utilize Disposition Code 'NG', not guilty and record the disposition date

ADULT & JUVENILE UN-SENTENCED REASON CONFINED CODE 38 VIOLENT SEXUAL PREDATOR FOR ANNUAL COURT APPEARANCE

Effective July 1, 2005

PREFERRED METHOD OF REPORTING CERTAIN ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS CLARIFICATION (Revised)

<u>Reason Confined Code</u>	<u>Description</u>
38	Adult & Juvenile Un-Sentenced Violent Sexual Predator for Annual Court Appearance

The Virginia Center for Behavioral Rehabilitation is a facility operated by the Department of Mental Health. Individuals therein confined are held on a civil commitment order issued by the Circuit courts of the jurisdictions. Once they have been civilly committed to the Department of Mental Health and placed in the program, the Virginia Department of Corrections (DOC) has no further authority over these inmates, and the inmates are no longer serving any felony sentence. The statute that allows the courts to commit these individuals to the program requires that the Circuit court that committed the individual review the commitment status each year on the anniversary of the original commitment. The Circuit courts issue a transportation order and the local sheriff deputies pick up & transport inmates for this annual review. The inmates are generally only out for a few days for their annual review.

PROCEDURES:

- Confine inmate utilizing Reason Confined Code 38, Unsentenced violent sexual predator for annual court appearance
- Utilize VCC Offense Code: PRI9917S9 - temporary hold
- Offense date equals committal date
- Payment status = LD (\$8 per day)
- Release Reason Code 18, Court order if released to community, OR
- Release reason code 36, To state hospital

Many but not all cities and counties have adopted local ordinances which parallel Code of Virginia statutes. We want to give you the preferred recording method at those counties and cities when a local police officer and magistrate commit an individual to jail using a local warrant and commitment order.

Clarification of the preferred methods of reporting certain ordinance violations are listed below:

If the locality has an ordinance code that is the same as a state misdemeanor code, use a state misdemeanor Virginia Crime Code (VCC) and replace the 'M' with an 'O' to indicate the ordinance violation.

Use a State misdemeanor code when an ordinance code is not available:

EXAMPLE: DWI5413M1—record as DWI5413O1.



For cases when an individual is jailed using a local ordinance and the State of Virginia Crime Code (VCC) does not include a statute; for example: Drunk in Public, LIDS VCC's have been augmented to provide for this situation. Example: the preferred VCC is ORD9966S9. LIDS has many such VCC's.
